# YOUTH SERVICES PROGRAMS CHAMPAIGN COUNTY REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION WORKFORCE DIVISION ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS (Ages 16-24)

If one or more of the following applies to you, you may be eligible for the Youth Services Programs:

- ► Family income for the last six months does not exceed the higher of (a) the poverty level for an equivalent period or (b) 70% of the lower-level standard income for an equivalent period
- ► Deficient in basic literacy skills
- ► A school dropout
- ► Individual with a disability
- ► Homeless/runaway/foster child
- ► An offender
- ► An individual who requires additional assistance to complete an educational program or to secure and hold employment

# YOUTH SERVICES PROGRAMS ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS (Ages 14-24)

If one or more of the following applies to you, you may be eligible for the Youth Services Programs:
